
FUTURE OF ROYALS IS IN THEIR HANDS!

"All the signs are good for a long and loving marriage," Grant tells GLOBE. "Their union should prove to be strong and dedicated." INDEX FINGER Kate's fingers are close together and lean toward the index finger, meaning she's strong, determined and loves to learn. She's a survivor, a perfectionist and willing to please.

2 THUMB Her thumb is unusually long and dominant, says Grant. This indicates she's comfortable in command and is a great strategist. Kate has will-power, but can be independent without flaunting it.
